Message to our Readers

The persecution of Christians in Pakistan is escalating relentlessly. The dreaded blasphemy charge is hurled at innocent Christians every week, while the perpetrators falsely accusing them are rarely brought to justice. Those arrested for mob violence in the Jaranwala attack of August 16, 2023, where 21 churches were burned, were all released in July 2024, while Ehsan Masih, a peaceful Christian, was sentenced to death for sharing information on social media.

The Voice of America Urdu news telecasted that the Tehreek-e-Labbaik Pakistan (TLP) is fuelling much of the current rise in anti-Christian sentiment, even inciting mob attacks. This radical extremist Islamic party advocates for the implementation of strict Shariah laws, including the death penalty, for those who refuse to comply. TLP leaders believe that non-Muslims should be forced to pay an Islamic tax, known as jizya, for living in Pakistan. According to lawyers, one TLP zealot alone has been responsible for registering at least 20 cases against Christians in various cities across Pakistan, fuelling the growing climate of fear and intimidation.

Canadian Aid to Persecuted Christians (CAPC) is serving these brothers and sisters facing targeted attacks, abductions, false accusations, and lynch mobs, with a local team of volunteers visiting and providing on-the-ground support. You can save lives through our various programs. As you remember those who suffer, your prayers and donations will make a significant impact.

CAPC sends **monthly support** for several families with whom we have been working for a long time. A mother and son in Sri Lanka have been approved for **sponsorship**, and as they await their visas to Canada, we have also been able to send monetary help with living expenses.

Afghan Persecuted Christian Refugees are facing multiple challenges in Pakistan. Due to unrest and a recent bomb blast in Pakistan that killed 62 people, the local authorities are targeting and arresting Afghan refugees and deporting them. For Christian Afghans, this could mean a death sentence. Several believing Afghan families stuck in Pakistan and awaiting sponsorship have been provided with support for urgent needs and living expenses; given the increasing threats they face and inability to find work, these needs are ongoing for the near future. CAPC plans to continue providing humanitarian aid to Afghan refugee families.

CAPC is making progress with our **self-reliance program**, in which we assist victims of persecution to set up small businesses. The family of a three-year-old rape victim has been moved for their safety and the father supplied with a small business to make and sell fries on the street, with the goal of becoming self-supporting. We are still looking for funds to outfit a small beauty parlour for Mehik, who was abducted as a young teenager. She and her sister have taken the necessary training for this business to enable them to support them, their mother, and Mehik's daughter.

Nasir Masih Lynched in Sarghoda

In May 2024, Nazir Masih (Masih means "Christian") was accused of burning pages of the Quran. The Islamic mob surrounded Nazir Masih's house and small shoe factory, dragged the elderly man into the street and lynched him; kicking and stoning his defenceless body. Even the ambulance that came to take him to the hospital was attacked and vandalized by the mob. All suspects arrested in connection to this attack have now been released.
